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INTERNATIONAL ANTI-CORRUPTION DAY MANIFESTO

Today, the think tank of the International Association to Change the World commemorates International Anti-Corruption Day with a counter-revolutionary manifesto on corruption, written by its founder and corruption expert Javier Marzal.

The Manifesto is a summary of the book on global corruption that the author is currently finishing. It reveals the deception perpetrated by international governmental organizations (intergovernmental) regarding what corruption is, which has manipulated public opinion on the matter. The Council of Europe (CoE), the United Nations, the OECD, and the European Union have participated in this deception, which leaves the population defenseless.

This misinformation is developed in the following points:

- Definition of corruption by a Spanish Supreme Court prosecutor, incorporating international standards.
- Corruption as a cause of decline according to international standards.
- Misinformation regarding this definition in international standards and in the criminal codes that develop them, by leaving out systemic corruption that destroys societies according to the anti-corruption standards themselves.
- Misinformation in public opinion, caused by the misinformation in the previous point.
- Broadening of the definition of corruption, which requires changes to international standards and the classification of crimes.
- Alliance of the three branches of government (executive branch of the government, legislative branch of parliament, and judicial branch of prosecutors and judges) to create systemic institutional corruption and incorporate other powers into it.
- Official data on corruption. Information on Spain is included because its corruption is better documented and it is the model being followed by the European Union, highlighting that none of the five presidents of the



bipartisan government have ever been criminally prosecuted.

- Contemporary revolution of corruption.
- Counterrevolution with public knowledge of the Revolution of Corruption.
- Call to action by sharing the Manifesto.

The author of the Manifesto believes that systemic corruption has been the great revolution of our time, leading us into decline and making our daily lives worse, according to official data. International anti-corruption standards themselves have been warning for decades that systemic corruption is a revolution that can destroy our rules of coexistence, electoral processes, the human rights of 1948, the rule of law, the structures for creating wealth and employment; in short, our quality of life.

Media coverage of the investigation and prosecution of corruption cases has been driven by this institutional manipulation, contributing to the creation of a misguided public opinion of what corruption is and, worse still, leading the majority to believe that they know what corruption is and even that they are experts on the subject.

The same can be said of the abundance of university master's degrees and events on corruption.

This context of misinformation about the greatest global (worldwide) danger, about the most important human factor today, has allowed for aberrations such as the UN's Agenda 2030, the European Green Deal, the climate emergency, and the 2020 pandemic, as well as the real possibility that the world war promoted by the European Union and NATO will become a reality.

These last two institutional versions have been officially and scientifically refuted by the US government and Congress, respectively.

Therefore, this Manifesto must produce a counter-revolution that eliminates the revolution of corruption, changes international norms and criminal laws, and does not allow decadent aberrations by governments and their intergovernmental organizations.

Influential people (media and social networks) have the opportunity to be part of this historic cultural change in public opinion that is essential to reverse the decline.

The Manifesto ends with the following text: "The integration of various systemic forms of corruption, such as institutional and media disinformation, war, corporate, monetary, financial, macro-state and international organizations, has



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created the Revolution of Corruption that has led us to decline, to live worse every day. Now that we know this, we can create the counter-revolution that will destroy the Revolution of Corruption. You can participate in the counter-revolution by sharing this statement."

The manifesto is published in Spanish, English, French, and German.
